

Cromwells invasion of Ireland in the 1650s saw his troops march through Clonegal, where they met with significant opposition. The battle of Clonegal as it became known is reputed to have been so fierce, that the river Derry ran red with the blood of the fallen and Cromwells troops were able to march dry footed across the river on their corpses
