Interesting Facts.

Many have concerns about how to handle their own or their relative's decision-making capacity as a result of illness or cognitive decline. If a person does not currently need support, but would like to plan ahead, they can make **An Enduring Power of Attorney**. This arrangement lets the person appoint someone as their attorney. Their role is to act on the person's behalf to make certain decisions if the person is unable to in the future. If a person wishes to plan ahead in relation to their future healthcare, they can make An Advance Healthcare Directive. This arrangement lets them set out their wishes regarding treatment decisions in case they are unable to make these decisions in the future. Importantly, it lets them write down any treatment they do not want. This allows a person to appoint someone as their designated healthcare representative to ensure their advance healthcare directive is followed. These and other similar issues are dealt with by the Assisted Decision-Making (Capacity) Act (2015). Full details of which can be found on the HSE Website
