Jan. 2021 saw the last of the copies of the book Golden Memories sold out.

Although the group couldn't meet the success of the book of photographs encouraged the group to decide remotely to proceed with a second edition.

The decision to mark the historic impact of the Covid 19 Pandemic by creating a time capsule was put on hold as the pandemic did not abate as anticipated.

As things eased in the summer plans were made to proceed with burying the time capsule which contained over 60 contributions from people in the community.
