James Freney a Kilkenny Native and 18th Century Highwayman spent much of his time on the run, in Clonegal's own Sherwood Forest, Kilcarr Wood. From there he executed many of his robberies and just like Robin Hood is reputed to have used the spoils to assist the poor with paying their rent. He is also reputed to have shoed his horse with the shoes on back to front to confuse the authorities who were tracking him as to the direction he was travelling in
