Fun Facts ???

A Mr. Devereaux who lived in Cranemore Kildavin well over a century ago was reputed to make some of the finest Poitín in the area, it was a much sought after if illegal whiskey. Eventually the poor man was caught and arrested by the authorities and ultimately sentenced to two years in prison. He would serve this sentence in Kilkenny gaol. It is not known how but the governor of the prison was aware of the fine quality of the Cranemore man's Poitín. He struck a deal with his prisoner. The terms of the deal were that Mr. Deveraux would be supplied with the ingredients necessary to make his Poitín and he in turn would supply it to the prison governor and in exchange, he would dine at the governors table and never have to eat prison food . Having served his sentence, Mr. Devereaux returned to Cranemore and to the supprise of his neighbours was two stone heavier and sporting a brandnew suit.
