Interesting Facts???

In the Townland of Clonogan near Clonegal there is an area known as The Acres. This represents eight Cheshire acres granted to followers and supporters of Cromwell following his invasion of Ireland in the mid-1600s. A Cheshire acre represents about two and a half standard acres. Jolly was one of Cromwell's beneficiaries and Jolly's Lane in that area still bears his name,
