In the mid-19th century tithes were imposed on a Catholic population to support the established Church. While protests were mainly peaceful some violent clashes did occur. One such battle occurred at a fair in Bunclody and a verse was penned by a Kildavin native to record the death of two Kildavin men.

"Eleven Dead and fourteen wounded lay on the virgin plain. Alas among the dead lay young Colclough and James O Neill"
