The supervisor said "Mrs. Kane we have a present for you". A main fuse was installed, and the house lit up

1918 saw partial voting rights for women passed through Parliament.

When the tractor came into use a lot of the horse machinery was converted for use with the tractor

Smokers used as a substitute the leaves of a plant known by its Irish name, *'Sponc'* 

The sentry was occupied with a woman (or the local good thing if you like),
