



Interesting Facts:!!!! Luke Hayden provided the following details of a local custom to Kildavin N.S. during the schools project of the 1930s "In olden times the people used kneel down and pray on Ash Wednesday on every cross roads when they would get the blessed ashes from the priest.

When they would be coming home about four of them would kneel on every cross roads and say the rosary and they would make the sign of the cross on their foreheads".
