Interesting Facts??????

Up until the latter half of the twentieth century residence of the road known as Ballinvalley Lane just north of Kildavin would avoid travelling the portion of road which exited on to the main Carlow Wexford Road at or around midnight. Residents who lived close to this exit would often travel to the other end of the lane exiting on to the Kildavin Myshall road when going or coming to the village of Kildavin late at night even though it was a much longer route. The reason for all this caution was a horse drawn funeral cortege moved along this portion of the lane at midnight. The cortege was believed to have not been of this world. A group of young men returning from a night's revelry who crashed their car on the lane asserted that they had to swerve to avoid the funeral which then disappeared. Thankfully no real harm has come to anybody travelling this part of the lane.
