Interesting Facts!!!! The sinking of the Titanic after its collision with an Iceberg in 1912 was one of the worst maritime disasters in history and this week we read that the infamous ship has claimed five more lives, 111 years on. The ship carried 2,223 people. 1,517 perished. 164 of the Titanic's passengers were Irish and 110 of these were among those who died. 5 Irishmen died during the building of the ship in Belfast's Harland and Wolff. 14 people from the Parish of Adergoole in Mayo were on board the ill fated ship. Only 3 survived
