

#### Interesting Facts??????

Brehon law was a system of law applied in Ireland, prior to the imposition of British Common law. Decisions in matters of disputes or unacceptable behaviour were handed down by Brehons, the ancient Irish equivalent of judges. Unlike the judges of today. they often mediated in disputes between individuals. The townland of Orchard just outside Clonegal is widely believed to have been a seat of Brehon Law. There is no local folk tradition as to who the Brehon was. However, bards who are defined as historians, genealogists, teachers and men of literature in the Brehon tradition also existed in Orchard and are reputed to all have belonged to a family known as Fleming.
